

Dress Code for Golfers

One aspect of the sport of Golf is a traditional standard of dress. We will maintain a degree of traditional golf etiquette by providing guidelines for appropriate dress at our course.

1.0 Purpose

To provide all patrons of the golf course with clear rules that will ensure the expected standard of dress is maintained.

2.0 Clothing that is Permitted

- Shirts with a collar and or sleeves
- Shorts that come at least mid-way down the thigh
- Traditional long pants
- Ladies capri style pants
- Ladies golfing skirts and skorts
- Jeans that are not worn, torn or faded

3.0 Clothing that is not Permitted

- "Muscle" shirts, tank tops (including spaghetti straps), tube tops
- "Sweat" pants or shorts
- Worn, torn clothing
- Tee shirts or other clothing with inappropriate (profane or vulgar) graphics

4.0 Footwear

No metal spikes or inappropriate footwear allowed

5.0 Awareness of Dress Code

Every effort will be made to ensure that everyone who ventures onto the golf course, including non-golfing visitors, is aware of the dress code in order to ensure their golf experience is pleasant. The policy will be posted, employees will be well informed, and the Club's website will include the dress code.

6.0 Enforcement of Dress Code

It is the responsibility of the Golf Professional and Pro Shop staff to enforce the dress code for golfers. Where a golfer or other visitor to the course is not dressed appropriately they will be diplomatically offered reasonable options to meet the code, while ensuring the patron is not made to feel uncomfortable with the situation.

7.0 Administration of the Policy

The Dress Code Policy for Golfers shall be administered by the General Manager/Golf Pro

The Board of Directors will review this policy as required and make amendments as necessary to ensure its relevance and purpose
